UPCOMING EVENTS

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 5TH, PITA SUMMER MULTIPLEX: This is the last month for the 2015 Summer MULTIPLEX. This is a PITA registered shoot that limits the shots in all of the three events (singles, handicap and doubles) to 50 targets. It is also a competition with other pacific NW clubs with a gambling base of Lewis Class.

If you shoot all three events the cost is \$64.50. There will also be a state wide High Over All (HOA) winner. Last summer's HOA was Pete Hudson while this winters HOA was Mal Menzies. Both received very nicely engraved silver pins.

This month we will start the event at 5:30pm with doubles in order to finish before both darkness and the club closing hour of 9:00pm.

AUGUST ATA REGISTERED TOURNAMENT: Our monthly registered tournament will be Saturday, August 8th. Sign-up, field and target set-up will be 8:30 to 9:25 am. If there are new, registered trap shooters, a safety meeting will be held at 9:25am. The first squad will be sent to their posts at 9:30am. This will be a standard registered trap event with 100 Single targets, 100 Handicap targets and 50 pair of Double targets. The first 100 targets have an associated fee of \$25.00 while the fee is \$15.00 for each of the next 100 targets.

HANDICAP & WOBBLES ONE MONTH LEAGUE: Water fowl season will start on Tuesday, September 15th, 2015 (I believe). Per the last four years, JGC has held a one month, handicap and wobbles league to sharpen the waterfowl hunter's hand-eye-shot coordination as well as the trap shooter's for that opening.

The league will begin on Sunday, August 23rd and end Sunday September 13th, two days in advance of the waterfowl opener for the greater Juneau area. The league is open to JGC members and non-members alike. Normal trap fees applied to each individual entering the league. The league entry fee will be \$20. The fee is used as the "winners" prize. Winners will be the "outright winner", the runner up, the "middle" of the "pack" individual and the red lantern winner. The winner will collect 40% of the entry fees; runner up 30%, while 20% and 10% will go to the "middle of the pack shooter" and the red lantern winner.
