On Wednesday March 17th, 2021, Jack J. Weinstein of Eugene, Oregon passed away at the age 88 surrounded by family.

Jack, a graduate of Eugene High School, Class of '51, was born February 19, 1933 in Burns, Oregon to Archie and Delta (Frazier) Weinstein. He was drafted into the U.S Army during his first year at the University of Oregon and served in the Korean War from 1952-1953.

He worked at the Eugene Surplus Sales Store, starting part time from the seventh grade, until Urban Renewal forced him and his father out of the business. Jack continued to sell sporting goods in the Eugene area for 50 years at different locations. He was also very active in the health and fitness industry in Eugene going back to the 1950's where he first started working out at the Executive Health Club that was above was Ming's Chinese Restaurant on 7th street and owned and operated by Cecil Phillips, a former Mr. Universe. He managed Eugene Health and Fitness at 29th and Willamette in the late 1970's. His passion for making a difference in others lives was a part of Jack that always shined bright!

Jack joined the Cottage Grove Rod & Gun Club in 1962, which was later named the Cottage Grove- Eugene Sportsman's Club. An avid trap shooter (Oregon State Champion), Jack served on the board for 20 years and enjoyed the many friendships made during his tenure there. He also supported and worked with Ducks Unlimited in their fundraising efforts.

With these many connections that Jack made over the years, he was most proud to have helped locate, deliver, and donate over 800 lbs. of frozen game meat to the Eugene Mission. He continued to donate to the mission in this manner for 12 years. Jack also donated over 200 pints of blood to the Lane Memorial Blood Bank. He would often joke that having to raise six children would not allow him to give monetary donations, so his blood was the next best thing. His handsome photo is on display at the blood bank as he was considered a "Milestone Donor."

Jack led a full life of endless love and support for his children and wife. He enjoyed a lifetime of hunting, fishing, and rock hunting from the Oregon Coast to the Eastern Oregon desert. His beautiful home gardens were full of colorful flowers and magnificent roses. The collection of orchids in his home was another example of how he cherished life and enjoyed the beauty that it offered. His "family Famous" blueberry bushes will be missed by all who enjoyed and grazed upon them.

Jack was preceded in death by his parents, Archie and Delta, a brother Ted Weinstein, and his second wife for 50 years, Margaret Weinstein (Fuller). He is survived by his six children: Jack C. Weinstein of Springfield, OR; Michael Weinstein of Costa Rica; Lisa (Weinstein) Sprague of Springfield, OR; Jayne (Weinstein) Calmer of Beaverton, OR; Julie Weinstein of Captain Cook, HI and Thomas Weinstein of Kealahou, HI. Jack was blessed with eight grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.
