COVID 19 Protocols (Subject to change with State and/or County mandates)

Big Island Trap Club reserves the right to change any of the rules as stated below to meet The County of Hawaii mandates.

“The preventive policies outlined in the First Amended Emergency Rule #18, Safe Practices and Gatherings must be followed during the preparation, execution, and clean-up phases of the event. In addition, a registration process with a list of participants/attendees including seating assignments (when necessary) is **required** for all events. Upon request, this list will be provided to Hawaii County Civil Defense and the Department of Health to facilitate contact tracing if needed.” (County of Hawaii, Civil Defense Agency, November 1, 2021)

NOTE: Access to the range is limited to only those individuals who have received prior administrative approval to shoot, and only during requested dates and times. Effective: June 10, 2020.

For shooters who are travelling domestically, please be aware that the State of Hawaii has a mandatory Safe Travels program. Please be aware of the requirements that are in place at time of travel. <https://travel.hawaii.gov>. It is each individual’s responsibility to keep up with the latest changes made to the Safe Travels program.

Shoot will be open to authorized individuals only. Spectators will be allowed; but priority will be given to shooters and range help. Total allowed on a daily basis: 100 people. **If a shooter will have a spectator(s) with him/her, please let us know via email (email Kim at abu_96720@yahoo.com). You will receive a confirmation email that the spectator(s) will or will not be allowed in the range.**

There will be a designated person at the gate to do temperature checks prior to entering the range. Participants will wait in their vehicle and their temperature will be taken. Once they are cleared, they will be allowed in the range. IF their temperature is 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit, or higher they will be denied entry into the range.

Wearing of face masks will be required in enclosed areas (the office of the range) or where social distancing is not possible.

*”Masking outdoors is required in gatherings. Hawai’i Island is in a COVID-19 crisis situation and safety protocols as listed by the CDC and in the Mayor’s First Amended Emergency Rule No. 18 must be adhered to for the safety of all, and to maintain the capacity of island health care facilities to serve the island population” (Hawaii County Civil Defense Agency, dated November 1, 2021)

Pavilions are limited to 10 people.

Bathrooms are cleaned each morning and at the end of the day. In the bathroom there is disinfectant to spray high touch areas. Should any individual feel as they need to sanitize on their own, they may bring their own disinfectant wipes and sanitizer with them to the bathroom.

There will be no sharing of food or drinks. Each individual is responsible for their own food and drinks. **There will be no hospitality tent at the shoot (food, water, sports drinks available).** Please be aware of this and please be ready to provide your own food, water, and/or sports drinks.

Hand sanitizer and disinfectant wipes will be available in the office.

Trap house – there will be 1 person allowed per trap house.

Score Keeper and Puller – There will be only 1 score keeper and puller per trap house. Score keeper may sit on the bench, puller may stand on the side. Social distancing is required.

Each trap will ONLY have a score keeper, a puller, and an individual in the trap house. (TOTAL of 3 people per trap. Any more per trap, will not be tolerated. Trap assignments has been made and are to be followed.

Sanitization: Each individual will be responsible their own: hand sanitizer, alcohol spray, and or disinfecting wipes.

There will no congregating by the cashier office or score board.

Signs are posted throughout the range to promote the awareness of COVID 19 and how to mitigate the spread of COVID 19 among our community.

A list of authorized individuals will be provided to Hawaii County Parks & Recreation and Hawaii County Civil Defense.

Big Island Trap Club will follow all local and CDC safety guidelines for this event. Contact tracing and temperature checks will be completed for all participants.

Any violation of the mentioned above, will result in being dismissed from the range and the tournament. No refunds will be given.
