This issue of OT2 will bring you the results of the July Multiplex, the Buckmaster Memorial shoot at Boise, and the PITA Grand Pacific Championships at the Evergreen Gun Club in Washington.

July Multiplex Results.

27 clubs hosted 304 shooters and fired at over 41,000 targets.

Roy Williams from Boise and Alex Bringhurst from Pocatello posted the only perfect 50's for Idaho shooters. Al Alford and Randy Brixey earned one yard punches in the handicap and John Simmons and Terry Reininger took half-yard punches for their 47's. Idaho shooters had 14 "hits" on the Lewis classes.
