



## **Ronald Halterman**

October 26, 1944 — February 9, 2025

Ronald Patrick Halterman, a long time resident of Klamath Falls and Keno, Oregon passed away at Sky Lakes Hospital in Klamath Falls on February 9th. Ronald was 80 years old.

Ron was born in New York City and spent his early years there. After World War II ended he lived in several locations including Tacoma, Washington, Bend, Oregon, Biloxi, Mississippi, and finally in Klamath Falls. He also spent more than a year living in post-war Japan while his father was stationed there.

After graduating from Klamath Union High School, Ron enlisted in the U.S. Marines and served a tour in Viet Nam in a ground combat role. Upon returning to the states he settled once again in Klamath Falls.

Ron was an avid outdoor sportsman who enjoyed deer, elk, duck, and goose hunting. The latter interests lead him to becoming a decorated trap shooter which he pursued for many years as a member of the Klamath Gun Club. He held a record of 200,000 officially registered shots during trap competitions in the region.

Ronald was also interested in the ancient cultural history of native Americans across the local area and spent many years exploring the locales and sites of historical significance for ancient tribes of the Klamath region.

Ron is survived by two brothers - Randy Halterman of Yakima, Washington, and Robert Halterman of Eugene, Oregon.
